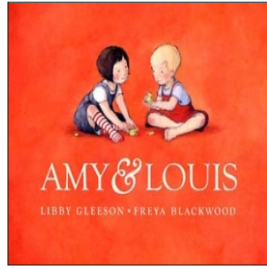

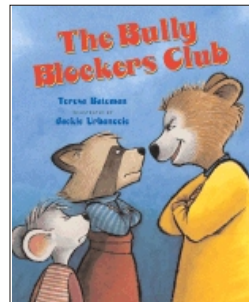
Amy and Louis live next door to each other and they do everything together...until Amy moves away. Then Louis discovers how to rebuild their special bond.



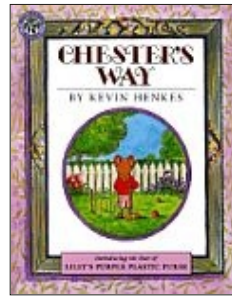
Moses and Zaki, an iguana, are friends and in common they have special needs. Shows that living with a disability and facing its challenges can be interesting and even positive.



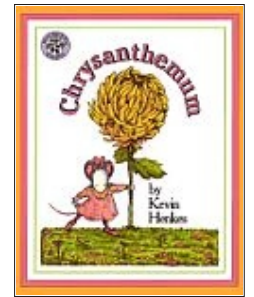
Lazlo doesn't look or speak quite like the other kids so they taunt and tease him. When Ellie realizes how tough things are for him she reaches out, and learns a lot.



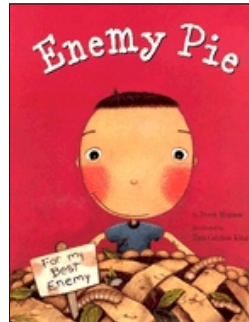
When Lotty begins a new year at school a bully makes her life miserable. Find out how she copes and all about her brilliant idea that works



Chester and Wilson have their own way of doing everything together. They are two of a kind and that's the way they like it until indomitable Lilly moves into their neighbourhood.



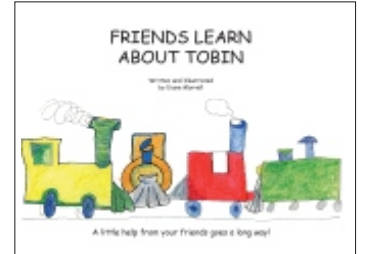
Chrysanthemum thinks her name is absolutely perfect, until she is teased because she's named after a flower. She wilts. What will it take to make her blossom again?

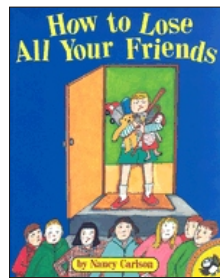
To squish or not to squish. What can happen when a big and a small creature encounter one another? Fostering tolerance and respect for diversity in children of all ages. Values? Yes!



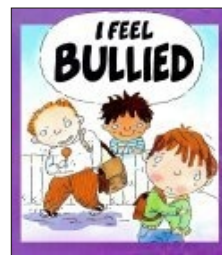
A fearful little rat who has an issue with his "r's" finds his inner strength and wins the day over the newly arrived bully.



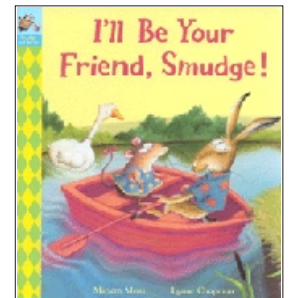

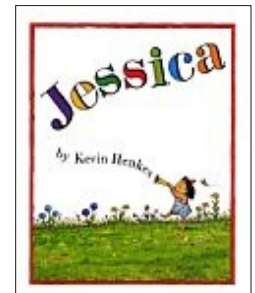
It's Smudge's birthday, but she and Stripe have moved house and haven't made friends to invite to her party. She's feeling a bit sorry for herself but Hare will fix that



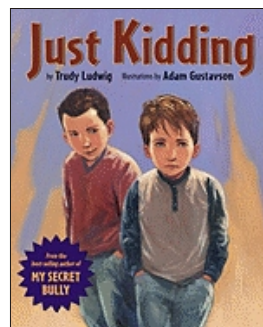
Jesse's sister struggles to understand her brother - and the kids who make fun of him. About friendship and appreciation of kids with special needs



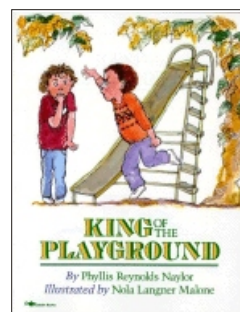
It's terribly difficult to share when you've just got a brand new fishing-net, but Smudge soon realizes that sharing is much more fun



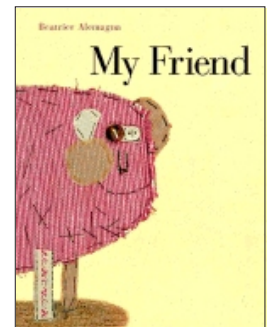

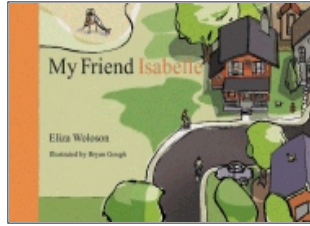

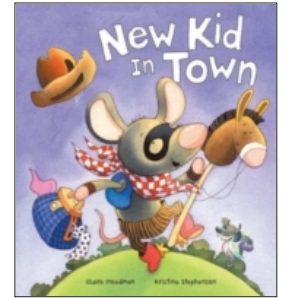
# Friendships



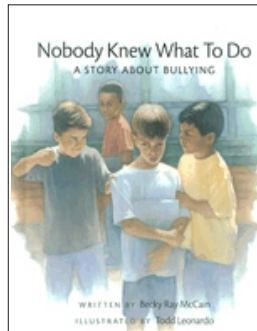
A true story of Isabelle, who has Down syndrome, and Charlie, who does not. They like to do many of the same things, but like most friends, they are also different from one another.



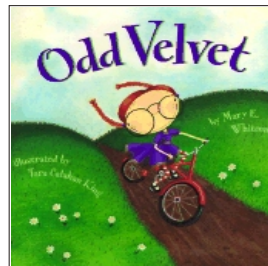

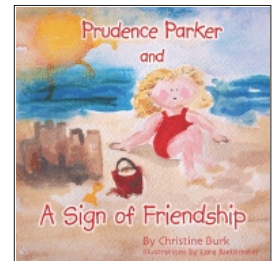
Mouse is excited about his new home but intrigued by the dreaded wolf the others are so afraid of. Mouse finds a new friend for everyone.



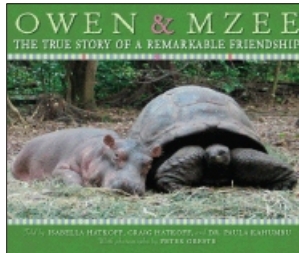
Though these children know it's not okay to hurt a person, they didn't know how to cope when the bullies yanked Ray out of the group. What will happen when one boy tells the teacher?



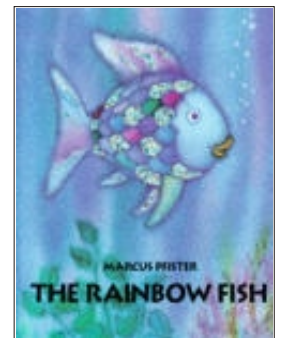
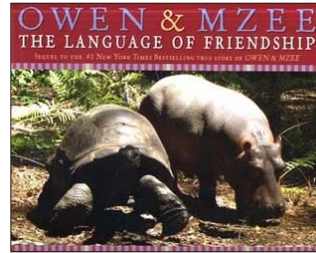
No one wants to be different like Velvet but as time goes by the others realize that this special little girl is not so different after all.



Prudence discovers the importance of communication and empathy when she relies on her limited sign language to make friends with Haley, who is deaf.



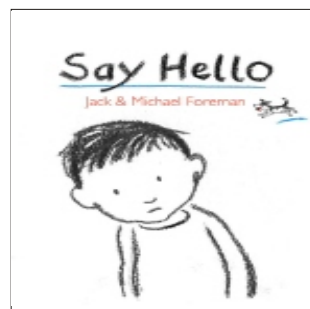

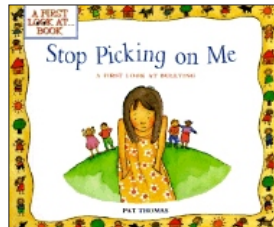
Something Else tries to be like everyone else. But every thing he does shows how different he is. Then one night...



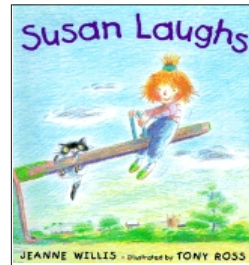
Jack's friend Sam seems to know how to get away with just about anything. Adults always back down when you say you're sorry, but does an apology count if you really don't mean it?



Ronald Durkin makes fun of Molly when she begins a new school. But Grandma's words are never far from her thoughts and Molly Lou knows just what to do..



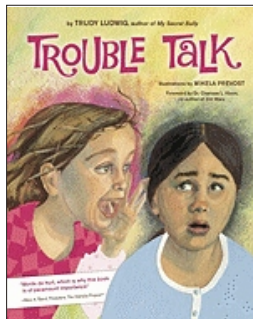
The fears, worries, and questions surrounding this upsetting experience are explored with notes for parents and teachers on how to use the ideas in this book



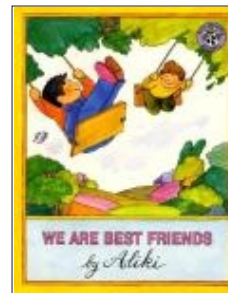
Susan does lots of things and she feels the same way as other kids feel, she just has different special needs.



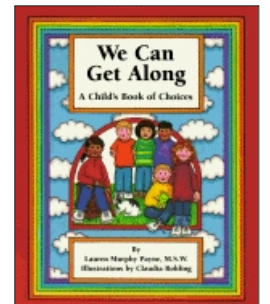
Tobin learns to make special changes in himself in order to be friendly towards his playmates.



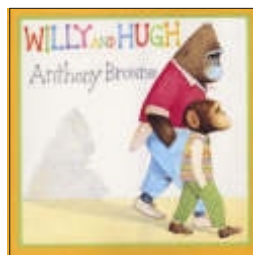

When his best friend Peter moves away, Robert has no one to play with, to fight with, or have fun with. Then he meets Will ...

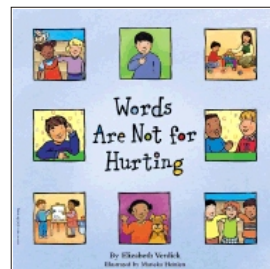


Subtitles "A child's book of Choices". We all have the power to make good choices such as - think before you speak or act and treat others the way you want to be treated

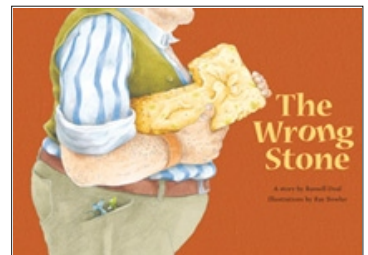


Willy and Hugh are very different but they can both bring something special to their friendship
